Dear Friends,

As we come into March, and begin to feel the real effect of the lengthening days, and the amazing rate of growth around us in this beautiful part of the Broads, a certain motivation towards creativity begins to take over- it doesn't matter really what form it takes: you might be a gardener, artist, poet, woodworker, or you may just love being outside. Those feelings of winter-induced apathy begin to lift, and latent projects are planned and take shape. You may have heard of the poet Gerard Manley Hopkins, and he wrote this about how he saw Spring, way back in 1877: 'Nothing is so beautiful as Spring- when weeds, in wheels, shoot long and lovely and lush; Thrush's eggs look little low heavens....have, get, before it cloy, before it cloud, Christ, lord, and sour with sinning...'

There's something in that about spiritual reality, optimism and hope. For some of us, it is making the journey from defeat to victory, and what better time than Easter to to take a fresh look at how we respond to the events of the cross and resurrection for ourselves? Defeat had been turned into victory for those early disciples, and it's the same for us now- we can step out in faith in the risen Jesus. Here lies new life, new beginnings and new hope. God knows this only too well, because he knows and loves us, and gives us the opportunity on a daily basis of living life to the full, whatever that might mean for us.

May this season prove to be a great blessing to all of us here in the Waterside Benefice, and here's a prayer that you may wish to use:

'Heavenly Father, rekindle my faith this Easter-time. Assure me, through experiencing again the presence of the risen Christ in my heart, that with you nothing is too good to be true, for you are able to do more than anyone could ever imagine. To you be praise and glory, now and for evermore. Amen.'





Planning

PF/23/2191. Fenside, School Lane. Extension of existing garage to create double-bay garage and erection of front porch.

PF/23/2525. Avalon, Norwich Road. Demolition of existing single storey garage and erection of new single storey garage.

<u>Defibrillators</u>

The Parish Council defibrillator lives on the wall of Throwers and is in a heated secure defibrillator box. Unfortunately, it is no longer working and is out of warranty. The Parish Council is working towards funding a new defibrillator which will come to around £750. In the meantime there are defibrillators at the Village Hall and at Hunter's Yard. 
