

#### The Reason for the Season:

It was Pope Julius, in AD353, who authorised December 25<sup>th</sup> to be celebrated as the birthdate of Jesus. This followed a great deal of research by learned people of the time but, it must be said, the evidence that this is the actual date is not strong. To me, it doesn't matter. Christ had to be born at some time and this seems as good a date as any. But I doubt whether, when Pope Julius made that declaration, anybody would have foreseen what it would become in our day.

Similarly, when professor Charles Follen, in 1832, lit candles on one of the first Christmas trees in America, nobody, in their widest dreams, could have imagined how elaborate the decorations would become. Over 2000 years have passed since that dark night was brightened by a guiding star that led the wise men to King Jesus's humble birthplace.

Yet, as we approach December 25<sup>th</sup> once again, amidst all the excitement, decorations and commercialisation, let us all be very intentional in keeping Christ at the centre. Let us pause to reflect and worship God as we consider afresh the outlandish Christmas story of His rescue plan for humanity by actually taking on human flesh and becoming a vulnerable baby.

So perhaps it would be good to take a moment this Christmas to, ourselves, follow that guiding star. Carol services are a super way to 'catch up with God' and what an excellent thing to do with our family and friends - taking time to consider the real reason for the season in joy and love.

Our churches in this Benefice wish you all a truly blessed and happy Christmas.

Notes from the meeting held on 9th November 2022

- Council received a petition by a local Traffic Action Group to address speeding and traffic conditions on Mill Road, Bridge Road and Station Road. Council will take the petition under consideration.
- The Boundary Commission for England concluded its revised proposals for new constituency boundaries and Potter Heigham will remain under North Norfolk District Council

- The Potter Heigham Trust Fund had supported improvements to Ludham School who were developing the school ethos and vision towards embracing the principles of Forest School.
- A Highways visit took place on Friday 4th November with Councillor Lovick to confirm the status of problem areas in the village including potholes, road markings, road signs and drainage issues. A running log of reports and status will be provided on the Parish Council website moving forward.
- The Police and Crime Commissioner was unable to attend a meeting with the Council to discuss resources in the Village. Council representatives have been invited to attend a Q&A on 5th December to raise their concerns.
- · Council sent a letter of thanks to Latham's for litter picking in their Car Park.
- The draft 2023/24 Council budget will be presented at the December meeting for first consideration.
- · Council agreed to begin the December meeting at 7:00 pm instead of 7:30 pm
- Council will participate in training on November 10<sup>th</sup>
