Recycling

The Parish Council receives approximately £1,000 per year for glass recycling in the bottle banks round the village. The costs associated with these bottle banks are around £500, so the profit goes directly towards supporting the village. Thank you to those of you who recycle your glass in the bottle banks. As a reminder, the bottle banks are in the following locations:

- The Dog Inn
- Ludham Bridge
- Womack Staithe
- The Kings Arms

There is also a Textile recycling bank at the Village Hall. This takes clothes and other textiles (please put them in carrier bags to protect them). The Parish Council can receive up to £100 per year from North Norfolk District Council, with no associated costs for this.

Speeding, driving carefully and deer on the roads

Please take this opportunity to think carefully about the speed you are driving on all roads especially on roads such as School Road which are narrow and where pedestrians are often in the road. Also be aware that the problems with deer on the roads are significant and extremely dangerous. Visibility at this time of year is particularly poor with grass verges and hedges growing quickly so please drive carefully and slowly around our village
